Vice Chair Epps made a motion to close the hearing. Seconded by Chair Martin. The Commission was polled. The vote was unanimous.

ADJOURN

An adjourned meeting of the Russell County Commission was called to order.

Reverend Ralph Wooten with First United Methodist Church gave the invocation.

Chair Martin led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Scott Holmes announced he was the Chair for the Alabama side of the river for the United Way Campaign for last year. The United Way hit their goal for last year on this side of the river and the whole community. Russell County hit their goal that was set for them. There were three departments the United Way would like to congratulate and recognize (1) Russell County Sheriff's Office, (2) Judge Harden and Probate Office (3) Russell County Tag Office.

Chair Martin thanked Cable T.V. of East Alabama and the Citizen News of East Alabama for their coverage of the Commission Meetings. She also welcomed Elected Officials, Department Heads, Media and Guests.

County Administrator LeAnn Horne established a quorum. Members present were; Chair Peggy Martin, Vice Chair Cattie Epps, Gentry Lee, Ronnie Reed, Chance Corbett and Larry Screws. Carl Currington was absent. Also, present was the County Attorney Kenneth Funderburk.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Chair Martin requested approval of the May 8, 2019 Minutes. Commissioner Corbett motioned to approve. Seconded by Commissioner Epps. The vote was unanimous.

PROCLAMATIONS:

Chair Martin read the Proclamation in remembrance of Dr. W. Spurgeon Warr. No family members were present. Chair Martin motioned to approve. Seconded by Commissioner Lee. The vote was unanimous.

Commissioner Screws introduced Charlean Tolbert Crowell who has done an outstanding job in the City of Hurtsboro in working with the youth recreation activity.

DISCUSSION:

Scott Holmes gave an update on the Old Post Office hazardous material study. Mr. Holmes stated: Everything basically that is painted on the building interior and exterior was lead base paint which most can be encapsulated. As far as asbestos most of it was confined to the basement area. The basement is was not originally in their scope. Mr. Holmes stated: They would get an estimate to abate it. All of the ceiling tiles were bad which is not a big deal to remove and replace. The glue from the carpet and the floor tile is asbestos contained material. Which means anytime the carpet is replaced in the future it would be a dangerous situation. This will be added in the job to take it up. The exterior window caulking was asbestos material as well. None of this is dangerous for anyone today. It becomes dangerous when it is being removed. The workers will be made aware of this. The intent being that when the work is done the building will be safe. Another thing they are waiting on is the City is trying to do the street scapes out in front of the building. It has been put on hold because they are changing the elevation of the sidewalk from the sidewalk that we have seen in the drawings. We want to modify the existing steps to make them all stone like the original steps. We need to know that elevation there, but I don't think we can wait on them any longer. We will just have to modify that bottom step and they work to our step.

Commissioner Corbett stated: I have an update on that after you get finished.

Scott Holmes stated: That would be great. We haven't had a lot of feedback from them of when that will happen, but I think beat them to the punch as when that is going to happen. If we have their drawings, we can get close to it. We have their preliminary drawings. The other thing we noticed as we were doing some final things the roof is leaking on the floor. We are trying to salvage a lot of the floor. It has gotten a lot worse in the last two weeks. There is a new roof top unit that sits behind the pitch roof so there was already going to be some roof work. The roof is in pretty good shape. The roof may not last 20 years but it will probably last five more years. We are definitely going to fix the leaks we have now. The shingle roof is not that expensive. It is not in our scope but if you want it to be, it can be.

Commissioner Corbett stated: The only update I have is Shawn Blakeney our Engineer caught me and Mrs. Martin in the hallway and asked to add something to the agenda. As soon as we are done with this one, I am going to ask that we add something to the agenda under business and that is the construction easement for the City on 14th Street because they are moving forward. They have contacted Shawn wanting an easement for that street scape project on both sides of the street.

Scott Holmes stated: I think that is a good idea because they could use more space to make that street scape work better and that is good for the County to have more space in front of the building. I think that is a request that should be looked at.

Commissioner Epps stated: Mr. Holmes talked about replacement of the roof, and I hope I understood you correctly. Is it leaking now?

Scott Holmes stated: It is leaking around the roof patch and that can be repaired just at that point. The membrane itself is not in horrible shape like the whole roof.

Commissioner Corbett stated: He will be patching the access to the attic to the top. It may take Leon Watson with the County Maintenance Department 30 minutes to fix it.

Commissioner Epps stated: I guess my question is that since it is leaking, and you start patching will you have to start patching somewhere else? Would it not be feasible to replace the roof?

Scott Holmes stated: It's all about money. My recommendation would be let's get a brand-new roof on it while we are putting this money on the inside. My decision would be put a new roof on it and get a 20-year warranty on it. I would do the roof before I did downstairs because downstairs may or may not be used. But the roof is protecting what we just spent money on in the inside.

Chair Martin stated: Scott, will you share with us an estimated cost?

Scott Holmes stated: I have been working on that and I can email it to LeAnn Horne, the County Administrator.

Commissioner Screws stated: Will you have the approximate amount ready for the next Commission Meeting?

Scott Holmes stated: I will have an idea.

Commissioner Corbett stated: Madam Chair, I was talking to Scott at one point and mentioned since he is doing an abatement estimate on this, because we had already on the Coulter Building and it is still a property that is owned by the County as well, not that we are committing anything but I think it would not hurt since they would already be on site to see that they would do the Coulter Building as well. Scott is planning to get a price on that. Again, not something necessarily that is tied to the project but if the price is right that is something we could talk about.

Scott Holmes stated: I did have that in there, we added the Coulter Building scope to that if your calling out all of that we are just going to take out the asbestos floor and the pipe. Most of the walls on the lower floor they are not original walls they are two by four walls. We are going to have that removed as well.

Commissioner Corbett stated: Madam Chair, before we move into business at this time because of the engineer approaching you and myself in the lobby, I would like to make a motion to add to an item to Business titled Construction Easement, City of Phenix City for that street scape project. If we get a unanimous vote that will be added. Seconded by Commissioner Lee.

County Administrator polled the Commission. District 1 Lee, yes; District 3 Martin, yes; District 4 Reed, no; District 5 Epps stated she did not get clarification on what we are trying to add to the agenda. What about the street now?

Commissioner Corbett stated: If you will let me explain that a little bit, it's a dead issue anyway with Commissioner Reed voting no. Shawn can tell the City that Commissioner Reed denied them the access to start getting the road done. The City asked for a construction easement on 14th Street where the Judicial Building is and where the Old Post Office Building and Annex all the property the County owns, the City is asking for a

construction easement. Not giving them anything and easement to be able to do the work they need to do the construction for the Street Scape Project.

Commissioner Epps stated: So, this is something the City is asking for?

County Engineer Shawn Blakeney stated: They are doing a project to redo all the crosswalks and sidewalks there in that area. They are trying to move forward with the project, and they will need some temporary construction needs. The County owns the property on both sides of the street.

Commissioner Epps stated: Since there is no cost to the County am I correct on that? Commissioner Epps voted "yes".

Commissioner Corbett stated: Madam Chair, based on the rules we put in place to add anything the day of the meeting takes a unanimous vote. With Commissioner Reed's vote, "no" it does not get added and you can just let the City know why.

Commissioner Reed stated: The reason I voted "no" is because Commissioner Screws one time wanted to add something to the agenda and they denied him, that's the way I feel.

Commissioner Lee stated: He wouldn't tell us what it was.

Commissioner Martin stated: We will vote on the two land abatements at the same time.

DISCUSSION:

Mr. Bill Friend Enforcement Officer stated: On the 8th of May this Commission by resolution declared of property on 49 Davis Circle/Road to be a public nuisance and a hearing was scheduled for today. At this time, I am requesting the County Commission by resolution to declare the property to be a public nuisance and order the abatement. The estimated cost of 49 Davis Circle/Road \$6300. Commissioner Lee motioned to approve. Seconded by Chair Martin. The vote was unanimous.

Mr. Bill Friend Enforcement Officer stated: The second abatement was located 10 Alexander Loop. At this time, I am requesting the County Commission by resolution to declare this property as a public nuisance. The estimate cost of this clean up is \$2800. Commissioner Epps motioned to accept. Seconded by Commissioner Reed. The vote was unanimous.

Commissioner Lee stated: Mr. Tommy Raiford is currently serving on the Board of Equalization and he desires to be reappointed. At this time, I would move that Mr. Raiford be nominated by the Commission to be on the Board of Equalization and signed by the Chair. This has to go to the Department of Revenue. They will make the final appointment. Commissioner Corbett seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Lisa Sandt with Lee/Russell stated: I am here this morning to ask for approval to move forward with the Community Development Block Grant for the Hatchechubbee Volunteer Fire Department. They contacted our office about applying for a community enhancement grant to replace their Fire Station and to purchase a truck during this funding cycle. The Russell County Commission based on the grant guidelines would have to be the applicant. We are here today to ask for approval to move forward with developing the grant, making sure it meets the guidelines, making sure that the County would be agreeable to be the applicant for this grant and submitting it by July 22. If they do meet the requirements of low and moderate income and the other grant guidelines we will come back in July for the formal approval. Right now, we are just asking if the Commission is willing to be the applicant and provide Lee/Russell to move forward with it. Commissioner Screws motioned to approve. Seconded by Commissioner Corbett.

Commissioner Lee stated: I would like to add one thing to that motion is that the Hatchechubbee Fire Department has pledged to be responsible for the match.

Lisa Sandt stated: They will definitely have recommended agreement of what they are responsible for.

Commissioner Lee stated: I just wanted it in the Minutes.

County Administrator polled the Commission. The vote was unanimous.

Commissioner Reed stated: I just wanted to say, Madam Chair, we already have these funds already in the budget for Teen Life University. I would like to make a motion we give them \$4500 which they requested.

Commissioner Lee stated: Where are these funds?

Commissioner Reed stated: These funds I had appropriated some money in my district to do some recreation projects. I have not used these funds yet, so that is where these funds are coming from.

Commissioner Lee stated: Just wanted it on the record.

Commissioner Screws seconded. The vote was unanimous

Probate Judge Harden stated: You have in your packet a business license refund. This was a case where a daughter asked their mother to come to us and get an additional license and the mother misunderstood and purchased a duplicate license. It didn't come to our attention within the 30 days that we have it in our we could have refunded it there, but the money was already sent to General Fund. At this time, just requesting that the amount of money be refunded to young lady who bought two business licenses within a few months. Commissioner Epps motioned to approve. Seconded by Commissioner Reed. The vote was unanimous.

Commissioner Corbett stated: As I mentioned on Monday night at the Work Session and at budget time our next project for that area was to put a gazebo up. Our committee has been raising funds to help get that done. As I said, we would be doing that for matching. It is time to send out bid invitations on the structure portion of the gazebo, although it will fall under less than what will public works, I don't want to take a chance at it as we get closer to that number. I want to go ahead and send bids. As I mentioned Monday night the letter to invitation to bid from the Administrator, the bid instructions and also the plans or specs for the actual structure. This will be just for the structure to have it fabricated and delivered to on site. We believe installation will happen with a local contractor. That will be a different fund raiser. Best estimate it will be October before the structure is even made. At this time, I make a motion that we send out bids for the fabrication of the gazebo structure. Questions will be due June 7 at 5:00 P.M. EDT. Bids will be due June 13 at 3:00 P.M. EDT and bids will be open June 13 at 3:30 P.M. EDT in the Russell County Commission Chamber. Commissioner Lee seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

Commissioner Corbett stated: As I mentioned on Monday night at the Work Session and previous meeting, I felt the need for years as an EMA Director for several years back in 2001-2007. I felt the need for a better building for our Emergency Management Agency. I have spoken with our current EMA Director Mr. Bob Franklin and he is in complete agreement with that. We have seen other counties around the state begin building Emergency Operation Centers and tying their offices into those and in some cases tying other County services into that. I feel that it is only right for the County to be proactive and start looking at plans. I am not asking to spend any money at this point. I am not asking to approve any plans. I am not even asking to approve any occupants of possible building in the future. I would like to look at the feasibility and what it would take the size, the scope budget wise to put a building on the property we purchased on Prentiss Drive on the corner of 5th Street South. The right way to do that instead of one or two people trying to make those decisions would be to put a Committee together. I would like it to be a Committee that is appointed by the Commission. As I mentioned on Monday Night, professionals that would have some stake in this or would have some

expertise in that field in Public Safety especially in Emergency Management and dispatching (911). The people that I would like to see the Commission at this point are the positions would be the position or their designee. It would be the Sheriff, the EMA Director, the 911 Director, the Phenix City Chief of Police and myself. I have also asked the City Manager Wallace Hunter and he has agreed also to serve on it. I am going to make that in the form of a motion that we create the Public Safety Project Study Group or Committee with those positions. I will read the again. The Sheriff, the EMA Director, the 911 Director, Phenix City Chief of Police, myself and the City Manager. Seconded by Commissioner Lee the motion on floor.

Commissioner Reed stated: Madam Chair, since this is in my District, I would like to make a motion to table it because I would like to see the Coroner to serve on that Committee.

Commissioner Lee stated: Can you just do it right now?

Commissioner Reed stated: At that time, I might have someone else in mind. I think we are moving to fast. I would like to table it right now. Seconded by Commissioner Screws.

County Administrator Horne polled the Commission. District 1 Lee, no; District 3, Martin, yes; District Reed, yes; District 5 Epps, yes; District 6 Corbett, no; District 7 Screws, yes. The vote was to table.

Commissioner Epps stated: We are to respect our Chair. We started off letting the Chair do the appointment and the Commission will vote.

Commissioner Corbett stated: That is not true.

Commissioner Lee stated: That is made up.

Commissioner Epps stated: Hold just a moment. My other thing is that I wanted to add to that you named some names and you didn't other ones. The 911 Director is who?

Commissioner Lee stated: She is sitting right back there.

Commissioner Epps stated: What is her name?

Commissioner Lee stated: Dana

Commissioner Epps stated: Are you the sister to Commissioner Corbett?

Commissioner Corbett stated: Absolutely, I am very proud of that. Commissioner Reed actually made the motion to give her the job.

Commissioner Lee stated: Madam Chair, point of order. This has already been voted down we do not even need to be discussing it. It has all been voted down move on to the next item.

Commissioner Corbett stated: I hope this is all in the Minutes. This would be good Mrs. Epps; this would be good.

Victor Cross stated: Monday night we talked about the results from the ASA Archery Tournament that was held in March of this year. We ended up with total of 1,962 in attendance. That does not include the people who came with the shooters and sponsors. This had an impact on our region of \$985,600 and we spent \$22,398 to get that kind of impact for the region. I would ask the Commission to entertain in hosting that tournament next year. The date will be March 26-29, 2020 the actual shooting dates. Commissioner Lee motioned to approve. Seconded by Commissioner Screws. The vote was unanimous.

Commissioner Screws stated: Lower Russell County Youth League is going to Virginia in August. I would like to put on the agenda under discussion item to make a donation to the league to go to Virginia. My next item which is more of a comment. I would like a financial report of where we are financially in the County. We seem to be asking to build buildings. We need to know or not if we have the money to do these things. There seems like a lot of projects being requested. I would like for the Administrator to tell us where we are.

County Administrator stated: I would just like to let the Commission know we have already started the budget process, we moved it up a couple of months.

Commissioner Screws stated: I would like to hear the report before the budget.

County Administrator stated: I was letting the Commissioners know since I haven't explained this to you yet, I was wanting it on the record.
